News from the "Boss", Rob Alsaker

During his trip to Norway last month our Boss caught up with Svein Ludwigsen, the Minister of Fisheries for Norway. Rob and his wife, Evy, met with Svein in his office just a few blocks from the Storting in Oslo.

Svein had been the honored guest and featured speaker at the 17th of May celebrations several years ago in Park Ridge and had fond memories of his visit to Chicago. Then, Svein was Vice-President of the Lagting, the Upper Chamber of the Norwegian Parliament. Among all the Norwegian activities that weekend that included a visit to our Assistant Boss, Don Hoganson's farm, the Alsakers took Svein to the Parthenon Restaurant in Greektown!

Svein hails from Tromso in Northern Norway and hopes to return there one day as Governor. He explained to Rob how the Norwegian northern coast is being over-fished and that he has called for a fishing moratorium in these areas. This has created quite a controversy in Norway because the fishing industries are concerned about their livelihood. Most of the Torske caught off the Norwegian coast goes to Scandinavia, Central Europe and Japan.
