Dr. Martin Marty Speaks at Ladies Day

The Chicago Torske Klub is honored to have the internationally known theologian and religious scholar, Dr. Martin Marty, to speak at the annual ladies day luncheon on February 12, 2011.

Dr. Marty is a Lutheran minister who served various congregations in the 1950s and 60s, he received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago in 1956 and has taught at the University of Chicago Divinity School over 4 decades, held an endowed chair and now holds emeritus status. The Martin Marty Center for the Advanced Study of Religion was named for him as a founding director. His honors and achievements fill multiple lifetimes; we can only name a few here: Fairfax M. Cone Distinguished Service Professor Emeritus of the History of Modern Christianity in the Divinity School. He is the author of over 50 books, 5000 articles and a columnist for the Christian Century since 1956. His many books include Righteous Empire: The Protestant Experience in America (1970), for which he won the National Book Award, the encyclopedic five-volume Funda-

mentalism Project, co-edited with historian R. Scott Appleby, and the biography, Martin Luther (2004). He has appeared as a guest at numerous seminars and broadcasts, including Bill Moyer of PBS. Dr. Marty is also the father of Minnesota State Senator John Marty, and of the Rev. Peter Marty who is currently the host of the ELCA radio ministry Grace Matters. He has served

on two presidential commissions. He serves on the Board of St. Olaf college, now as Senior Regent. His life after retirement is sufficiently complex enough to warrant a web site to track it at http://www.illuminos.com.
