"Norwegians in Hawaii" at the May Luncheon

We are pleased to welcome Jon Satrum to learn about a little known part of Norwegian history – Norwegians In Hawaii in 1881. Norway was suffering from an industrial depression with high unemployment at the same

time Hawaii had a need to expand their sugar plantation labor force. From their sea voyage to their working conditions, this was a very different story from that of other emigrant Norwegians.
