Our speaker this month is Gary Midkiff. Gary is a college professor who teaches MBA students, undergraduate business students and gifted high school students for Chicago area colleges including North Park University. Besides teaching American history, Gary is a published author and speaker. Gary has a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Chicago and a Master's Degree in Finance from the Kellogg School of Management at Northwestern University

In honor of the Illinois Bicentennial (Dec. 3, 2018), Professor Gary Midkiff has compiled a list of the 10 most important events in the history of our state (plus a few more that deserve attention). He will cover events from all corners of the state and connect many of those Illinois events to national history. Chicago will contribute a few stories (e.g. the Great Chicago Fire of 1871) but so will East St. Louis (the race riots of 1917) and the towns of Alton, Charleston, Freeport, Galesburg, Jonesboro, Ottawa and Quincy (sites of the 1858 Lincoln – Douglas debates).

With everything else going on at the end of 2018, we seemed to have forgotten the bicentennial that occurred on Dec.3, 2018 as the State of Illinois saw it's 200th year as a state. Our speakers this month and next will remedy that somewhat.

Things could have been a lot different for our state, and even the name. The early French fur traders named the territory by their mispronunciation of *Illiniwek*, the native people that occupied the place. That mispronunciation continues today as non-residents of Illinois describe us as Ell-e-noise.

Few of us realize that we were claimed and purchased as a part of the *Illinois-Wabash Company* in 1773. They were denied the claim to native American purchased land by the British, and later by the new nation of the United States. The company faded away as Col. George Rogers Clark claimed the land for Virginia. Virginia created the "County of Illinois" in November 1779.

We could have remained a part of Virginia, but the Illinois Territory was formed in 1809 with capital in Kaskaskia. Statehood soon followed in 1818.

One more hurdle could have pushed most of us, including Chicago, into *Ouisconsin* (later Wisconsin). The northern border was almost set at the southern tip of Lake Michigan. For football alone, the implications boggle the mind.
