The Chicago Torske Klub is 60 years old this month.

No group gets to that age without some history. We have transcribed that evolving story on our web site and it starts like this:

"In the beginning, there were three: Claus Nicoll, Andrew Highland, and Aasmund Rosseland. The idea of a torske club was born by these three men, following a visit to Minneapolis, where they were guests of the Minneapolis Torske Klub.

On February 27, 1960, a selected committee of nine met at the Chicago Norske Klub to organize the club. These were: Andrew Highland, Aasmund Rosseland, Claus Nicoll, Irving Gunderson, Reidar Rosenvinge, James Birney, Bernard Jacobsen, Chris Johansen and Irving Highland. They met five times drawing up rules and regulations with the results being the birth of our club May 14, 1960. Forty members attended that first meeting, and we have been meeting the 2nd Saturday of the month ever since, except for June, July and August. At the luncheons, only the freshest of codfish will be served, with melted butter, boiled potatoes, flatbrod, coffee and two servings of Aquavit. A top notch speaker will be invited to each of our luncheons to give a twenty minute talk. Dues will be \$1.00 per year, plus \$5.00 for the purchase of the aquavit. In the following years, the dues will still be \$1.00 but \$10.00 additional for the purchase of the aquavit payable on or near your birthday."

From that beginning, not much has changed. The dues have increased of course, and we have moved locations three times. From the Norske Klub in Chicago to the Scandinavian American Cultural Society (SACS) in the early 80's, to the Homestead Restaurant on North Ave for 2 years, and to our present facility at the Elk's Club in Des Plaines.

Scores of men have served to enable this group to function; too many to mention without omission. We devoted some space to this letter to remember those executive officers on whose shoulders we stand on. Most are gone but fondly remembered. Our current Board of Directors are listed below and those men commit time and energy to keeping us functional. Thanks to them.
